## AWAITING RESPONSE ON JH COMMISSION

Now that the JH Medical Research & Compensation Foundation Commission has ended and Mr David Jackson QC findings have been made public on the 21<sup>st</sup> of September. Neogiations have now commenced on the 1<sup>st</sup> of October between JH representatives, lead by Meredith Hellicar and a unions/sufferers committee lead by ACTU –Greg Combet, NSW Labour Council John Robertson & Asbestos support group - Bernie Banton, Jack Rush QC and Jonathon Beach OC.

The key goals for the negotiating team unions/sufferers will be to achieve funding for the compensation of current and future victims of Hardie products and to make very clear opposition to a statutory scheme proposed by JH company. Union/sufferers group will want continued access to common law rights and no reduction in compensation for victims.

Also goals from the union/sufferers side must include scope for detailed discussion of the funding structure for present and future asbestos compensation and the way in which the funding would be secured.

May I also take this opportunity to thank Peter Gordon of Slater & Gordon & his dedicated staff, Jack Rush QC, Turner & Freeman Lawyers & their dedicated staff & all those wonderful significant others who have shown such wonderful support to asbestos sufferers all over Australia in representing them at the Commission of Enquiry. I know I speak for all the asbestos sufferers now and into the future when I say a Big Thank To You All.

It has also been terrific news that all Premiers and Chief Ministers stated their full support for the ACTU Secretary, Greg Combet, leading the negotiations with James Hardie. The States and territories are taking all immediate steps to implement a possible ban on the purchase of Hardie products, should it become necessary. The ban will be implemented if James Hardie fails to agree in principle to a settlement with the ACTU and sufferers very soon.

We wish all those representing the unions/sufferers all our very best and we know that they will not come out of those negotiations without a just and fair outcome for all asbestos sufferers.

### JAMES HARDIE PROTESTS & RALLIES

Continuing on with our theme about James Hardie lets move on to the protest that took place on the 8<sup>th</sup> of September on parliament house steps. GARDS members travelled down by bus to join Parliamentarians, Victorian Trades Hall Council, Unions, ADSVIC, other asbestos sufferers and concerned community members to speak out about the dirty tactics used by this large corporation to avoid its legal responsibilities to asbestos sufferers. The "Make James Hardie Pay" campaign was launched with the face of one of our very own GARDS members Fred, who may I say was proud to help in his own way.

It was great to see our very own Victorian State Government standing with us on this very important issue and heart warming to hear the Attorney General Rob Hulls saying "It's a damn disgrace that a company like James Hardie has shown such callous disregard for loyal workers, for innocent workers – and their tragic plight". Parliamentarians, asbestos sufferers, workers and community laid yellow gerberas on the steps of parliament house, 500 in all, one for every person in Victoria expected to get an asbestos related disease this year. **Photos on page 6.** 

The 15<sup>th</sup> of September saw the GARDS members again travel down by bus to Trades Hall to march in a rally from there to the stock exchange. The crowd was enormous there were over 10,000 people who marched to show their disgust in James Hardie. This march and protest coincided with an information meeting for their shareholders being held in Sydney at the stock exchange. There was also a march/protest-taking place in Queensland as well. I am quite sure that the shareholders and the executives of James Hardie were well aware of the shame that has befallen James Hardie. **Photos on page 6**.

Another RALLY is now planned for Thursday October 28<sup>th</sup> outside the Telstra Shareholders' Meeting, 9.45am. Exhibition buildings (Jeff Shed, Spencer Street, opposite Casino entrance). Donald McGauchie is the Telstra Board chairman and a board member of James Hardie Industries. Many Telstra employees have gotten sick as a result of Telstra's use of James Hardie products - & yet the chairman of Telstra made decisions as a board member of James Hardie to keep Hardie's assets in the Netherlands and limit compensation for asbestos victims. GARDS members will again be travelling down by bus to join this rally please feel free to join us.

### GUEST SPEAKER – PETER GORDON

On the night of the 22<sup>nd</sup> of September we were privileged to have Peter Gordon from Slater & Gordon come straight from Sydney and David Jackson's QC findings on James Hardie MRCF to inform our members and interested community on the ramifications of those findings. Peter gave a run down on the shameful manoeuvres by James Hardie and its executives to try and evade its legal and moral responsibilities. Peter emphasized that this is no just a NSW issue, but an Australia wide issue and negotiations with Hardies and unions/asbestos sufferers will effect all of Australia's asbestos sufferers and their families, in particularly Gippsland which is experiencing one of the highest rates of asbestos related disease. These negotiations are an integral part of this process and will shape future of claims to come so it will be most important to get it right for the sake of future sufferers. One of the major things that came out of the night that was identified was that all of us whether it be State government, unions, asbestos groups supporting sufferers, law firms and community need to collectively push to see the Federal Government change the corporations law to make sure that no other company is able to ever do this again.

We thank Peter Gordon and his team for taking the time to come and inform us on this very important issue and answer the many questions that people had saved up to ask of him. Photos on page 6.

### MELBOURNE UNIVERSITY STUDY WORK & HEALTH IN THE LATROBE VALLEY

An independent study into asbestos related disease in the Latrobe Valley was launched at a community meeting in Moe on Thursday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September. This research was spurred on by Associate Professor Tony LaMontagne and his research assistant Hannah Walker from the Centre for the Study of Health and Society at the University of Melbourne and funded with assistance from VicHealth. the incitement for this research was an observation that the voices and perspectives of those most affected by asbestos disease are rarely heard in the formulation of responses to Australia's on-going asbestos disease epidemic. The goal of the study was to determine how a community affected by asbestos disease defines asbestos disease issues, and what they think could or should be done about these issues. As you would be aware Latrobe Valley has 7 times the state average for mesothelioma due to extensive use of asbestos in the past in the power industry. The study highlighted the need for the community to have input into the decisions made about how to respond to this on-going crisis. Associate Professor LaMontagne says, "Community members deserve a place at the table alongside government, health professionals and other stakeholders in ongoing formulation and implementation of responses. Speakers at the launch were: Latrobe City's Cr Bruce Lougheed, Associate Professor Tony LaMontagne, Vicki Hamilton Secretary GARDS, Luke van der Meulen, Victorian President of the CFMEU (mining & energy division) and Steve Dodd Organiser, AMWU. The launch was well attended by approx 50 people and copies of the report can be obtained from the GARDS office.



### VICTORIAN TRADES HALL COUNCIL OH&S DAY MOONEE VALLEY

As part of WorkSafe Week GARDS will take part in Victorian Trades Hall Council's OH&S day for Health & Safety representatives. This will take place on the 27<sup>th</sup> of October at Monee Valley Racecourse. GARDS will have a display stall to promote the organisation and the activities, advocacy, education and support that it gives to people with asbestos related illness and the general community.




