ISSUES ON IMPORTS INTO AUSTRALIA

In March 2016 an Independent Swedish review from KGH Border Services on Asbestos imports was handed down to Minister Dutton and it took five months to release this report to the public on the 4th August. At the blinding speed that government are moving on the issue of imports to Australia we will be awash with products in this country.

Remember that 12 Australians die each week from mesothelioma, in 2014 according to the Australian Mesothelioma Register 641 people died of mesothelioma in Australia. For every mesothelioma there are 10 other asbestos related diseases in the community such as 3 or 4 lung cancers, 6 or 7 asbestosis & pleural plaques sufferers. This government needs to get its head around imports in a big way – we will have more waves of people being affected by unwitting exposure sometime in the future with asbestos products installed in new building sites and homes across Australia.

Well where do you begin? – on this opposite page are just some of the products getting into Australia – Queensland State Government's new executive building – fondly known as the "Tower of Power", a 41 storey skyscraper, the potential deadly fibres were found in Klingerit 200 paper deadener, 60% chrysotile. The Health and Medical Research Institute SA and the Royal Adelaide Hospital – Company - Yuanda won \$85 million worth of contracts in South Australia installing the pine cone skin-inspired façade which was found to contain asbestos. Travel over to Perth to the \$1.2 billon New Perth Children's Hospital where ceiling titles made of asbestos all need removing and replacing. Australian Portable Camps found to have imported asbestos fibre board. In fact 64 sites across Australia have been known to have asbestos-tainted concrete fibre sheeting which has been used in construction. 17 sites in New South Wales 13 in Queensland, 11 in South Australia and 8 in Victoria. 8000+ known sheets of asbestos cement fibre board came into Australia and we



believe that this is just the tip of the ice berg. Has Border Force been able to find/trace all that board? – I think not!!! – what about the building materials that are not known and have slipped past undetected and are now installed in buildings around Australia?

Other imported asbestos products that came into Australia in recent times: a mining company that imported asbestos in gaskets for industrial equipment from Vietnam, and a West Australian company which imported chrysotile asbestos in machinery from China. Flange gaskets and brakes to monkey bikes – Diesel train engines, Entire production plants – Drilling lubricant material called nut plug, underbody protectant and sound deadeners. Did you know that products in America containing less than 1% asbestos are classed as "asbestos free". The finger print powder in CSI kits for children was friable asbestos. Fire wallets had a sheet of asbestos in them to protect hands from being burnt, Tug boats - Chinese built Svitzer tugs, Warrunda and Warrego, despite both being issued with asbestos-free certificates, 950 odd instances of asbestos on the vessel. Great Wall and Chery vehicles imported in 2012 fitted with asbestos gaskets – some 30 gaskets – 21,500Great Walls, Utes and SUV's – 2,250 Cherys. Crayons – boxes sold with branded names of popular children's characters like Mickey Mouse, The Disney Princesses, Ben Ten, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles etc. tested for, and found to have asbestos in them, some had two different kinds of asbestos in them – how long have they been

coming in like this? Tremolite decorative stacked

Polystyrene panels imported to be used in the construction of residential buildings found to contain chrysotile (white asbestos), Seaford South Australia rail extension and new electrical tram substations in Melbourne found to have concrete fibre cement floor sheeting in them -4 substations in East Brighton, the CBD, Thornbury and West Brunswick, in fact some 50 building sites have purchased asbestos-tainted concrete fibre sheeting from China. In China products can be legally labelled "asbestos free" if the asbestos content is less than 5 per cent. Chinese trains imported to New Zealand and Australia were found to contain asbestos, 10 of these locomotives were made by China Southern Rail to tow iron ore bound for China to port. Maintenance workers repairing a number of the diesel engines said there was a lot of white dust and asked if the white dust was safe – it was not – the white dust was chrysotile asbestos found throughout the locomotives, in insulation around the exhaust and muffler system, around coolant pipes and in the brake exhaust section near the roof of the driver's cabin.

The maximum fine for illegally importing asbestos is \$180,000 – this has never been imposed. The ACTU stated that the Federal authorities have prosecuted just three companies found to have imported asbestos-laced materials since 2003 and managed to raise a meagre \$300,000 in fines, despite the fact that just with this list we have compiled thousands of contaminated products are slipping past border controls. The ACTU are pushing a Senate motion in October 2016 to re-establish a Senate inquiry into non-conforming building products with a specific focus on asbestos importation after winning broad cross party support from Labor, Nick Xenophon Team, the Greens, and Pauline Hanson's One Nation. We hope this will get across the line.

Come on Federal Government get your head out of the sand and start getting fairdinkum about asbestos issues in this country.
