## ASBESTOS BANNED IN ALL AUSTRALIAN WORKPLACES

The Australia-wide ban on all new uses of asbestos & materials containing asbestos started on the 31<sup>st</sup> of December, 2003. It is illegal under the laws of each state & territory to use, re-use or sell any products containing asbestos, including automotive brake pads & gaskets.

The same prohibition applies in the Australian government sector & it will be complemented by a Customs regulation banning imports & exports.

The ban will not apply to asbestos products & materials that are already in place. But when they are replaced, non-asbestos alternatives must be used.

Any stockpiles of asbestos-containing products must be safely disposed of under the applicable state & territory regulations.

The few exemptions to the ban are restricted in scope & will operate for a limited time. They only apply where there are much greater risks to safety if asbestos is not used. Protection from exposure is still required in these cases.

## **MISSED CHANCE: ON THE REVIEW OF LUNG FUNCTION PROGRAM**

G.A.R.D.S. feels that the government has had a missed opportunity to properly address the asbestos situation in Latrobe Valley by not expanding the eligibility to include all asbestos exposed former power industry workers.

We are disappointed in what came out of the announcements on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2003 as the review pointed out the short comings of the LFP but that program is still going to continue with a few minor adjustments.

The Government has been formulating a response for the last 4 months and there was no community participation in formulating this. In the announcements there was no mention of how the community were going to participate in the recommendations made.

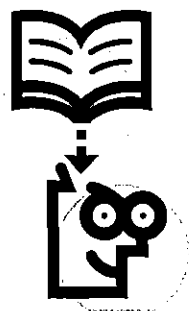
There was no mention in the government's media announcements of funding for any of the recommendations that came out of the Lung Function Review and further there was no mention or idea of how this was all going to work and come together.

G.A.R.D.S. agreed in part with the recommendations by the head researcher Professor Don Campbell but the government have made no promises on how these will be implemented. No time lines were drawn for specific recommendations or who will be responsible for these.

G.A.R.D.S. now wants to know when these recommendations are going to be implemented.

How will we know if it ever starts or if it is successful????

## LURGI GAS PLANT DEMOLITION

For sometime, residents, trade unions and community groups have protested for the demolition and clean up of the site of the Lurgi Gas Plant.

GARDS have visited the area and it is surrounded by a cyclone fence and is overgrown with weeds.

The State Government, as the responsible owner of the premises, have announced that they will call for tenders for the demolition of the site.

We understand that the tender has been filled by a company.

The factory site contained toxic chemicals of all kinds including asbestos.

We will be vigilant of the project and maintain that the asbestos & other toxic chemicals be removed safely and in accordance with the current regulations.

Gippsland Trades and Labour Council have said that before the demolition takes place an audit of all chemicals that were on the site should be obtained. There also needs to be full consultation with community and unions.

**GARDS was pleased to receive the news that Gippsland Trades & Labour Council agreed unanimously at a meeting in December to fully support and work with GARDS in their endeavours on asbestos issues.**

### SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER – COLLEEN LUX

Colleen Lux will be at both our meetings on 17<sup>th</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> of Feb. She is a graduate student at the University of Montana, USA in Environmental Studies. Her graduate research has focused primarily on the widespread tremolite asbestos exposure to miners, their families, & residents of Libby, Montana. Colleen's master's thesis focused on the community group which was organised by the Environmental Protection Agency to give voice to the Libby community during the Superfund clean up & remediation of homes & properties. Colleen is coming to speak about the hardships that the people of Libby, Montana have had to face with asbestos.

## DISPOSAL OF ASBESTOS

### **For the information of GARDS members who live in Latrobe City**

Owners/Occupiers of residential premises within the municipality may dispose of small quantities (under 3 cubic metres) of asbestos at the Morwell Landfill on Saturdays at 11am by prior appointment only with 48 hours notice required.

**Telephone Rod Shields 0439 957 019 for appointments and queries at Latrobe City.**

The asbestos is to be securely wrapped in two layers of 0.2mm thick plastic and sealed with adhesive tape. Unwrapped or inappropriately wrapped loads will not be accepted. Loads should be restricted to a size that may be carried by one person.

*Commercial asbestos contractors cannot have access to Morwell Landfill. Commercial asbestos may be deposited at Dutson Downs or Lyndhurst Landfill asbestos disposal facilities*

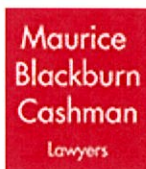
